- 3. District Communication:
  - a. Distribution of the Formula Education Grant Funds. INTENT: Academic and/or Cultural enrichment. GOAL: 100% graduation rate of Native Learners.
    - *i. Mr.* Bordelon reviewed an email from 5/24 which states the Grant Form was filled out incorrectly. Amy C will review the form.
    - ii. Tribal Goal 100% Graduation rate Academics and Cultural Growth
  - b. This year's allocation estimate: \$45,390/Approximately 175 students. Unless otherwise noted, the Committee recommends that this year's funding be directly submitted to the Bands/Museum in order to provide academic and/or Cultural enrichment. Unless otherwise noted, the funding is per student regardless of Kumeyaay or other tribal affiliations.
  - c. CURRAENT REQUESTS: *Mr. Bordelon: Money is purposeful, we have received 2 proposals so far for IVDM. Made sure everyone received a copy of*

the proposal. He communicated that money must be allocated by June 1<sup>st</sup>. He will continue to make phone calls to leaders.

- 1. IVDM: \$5,000 with \$5,000 District match for Museum Classes in District Schools
  - *i.* Indigenous Aart Faire: Introduction to Kristin & Luis 1862-1660 pre pandemic
- 2. La Posta Reservation: \$10,000(See attached proposal)
- 3. Deadline/Cut-Off for funding requests is June 1.
- 4. All applicants for funding require a written proposal prior to distribution.
  - *i.* May look at classes to shift focus- Not just on Kumeyaay Center
  - *ii.* Dr Keeley suggests scheduling time to speak with teachers.
  - *iii.* Cheryl Lugo suggests changing out activities to same as last year.
- 4. School Communications
  - a. Dr Keeley
    - *i.* EOY Activities. Close to JH Project. Counselors & the Book Room will move next to the Jr High. Jr High Building looks completely different. Lots of good contractors. The district received a Community Schools grant that totals \$4.2 Mil over the course of 5 years. Mental Health Program will expand Sow to Grow to all school sites. There is a need to Hire a Community Schools Coordinator. We learned that due to a clerical error we received a total of \$4,000 more. Next year the district will be applying to San Ysidro Health, Dental, Counselors, Parent Ed Programs development (PIQUE IS A GREAT MODEL) Costs will be revised (there is need to develop our own program- sustainable program)
    - *ii.* Strategic Vision- Portrait of a Graduate continues, aiming to earn Board Approval at the June 27<sup>th</sup> meeting. Grants to move the district. Strategic Plan is a long-term plan. 15 years down the road to have a foundation before you can build the house.
  - b. Mountain Empire High School
    - *i.* Participation of Every 15 minutes brought the school together. Bringing traditions back. Emotional hard week.
      - a) FFA -EC Fair goat & sheep groups.
      - b) Tues. -EL St Coyote for a day concurrent enrollment.
      - c) Automotive Shop Great partnerships w/Cuyamaca model program – EL CDE website
      - d) Guest Speaker- MEUSD grand EL Community Activist. Runner Up in School board
      - e) Graduation June 16<sup>th</sup>, with 100 graduates
      - f) Jr. High Promotion will take place Jun e 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - c. Alternative Education
    - *i.* Alt is working with students in 1:1 time to get to know each student, learning each one's attributes. Kids have had a hard time getting the swings of life, otherwise doing great academically. Enrollment is growing and the program is giving them all that it can.
    - *ii.* Bill L. attended San Jose to be a part of a former student's graduation who has an impressive Bio. He shared the positive outcomes for our

# students in Mountain Empire as students in smaller districts, feel noticeable. Many of our graduates are doing amazing things.
