### SAFETY DEVICES

There are a variety of options for securing firearms in your home, including gun safes, locked boxes, trigger locks, or cable locks. To find which safety devices are compatible with your firearm, visit https://oag.ca.gov/firearms/certified-firearms-fsd/search.

You can also contact your local San Diego Police station about receiving a free gun lock.

# GUN VIOLENCE RESTRAINING **ORDERS (GVRO)**

A GVRO is a court order requested by law enforcement that allows firearms to be removed from individuals who pose a threat to themselves or others. If you are concerned that someone who poses a risk of violence may have access to a firearm, contact your local police to obtain GVRO.
