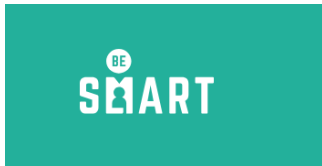

SAFETY DEVICES



There are a variety of options for securing firearms in your home, including gun safes, locked boxes, trigger locks, or cable locks. To find which safety devices are compatible with your firearm, visit

You can also contact your local San Diego Police station about receiving a free gun lock.

ASKING SAVES LIVES

Inquiring about firearm storage when your child is visiting another home is a simple way to keep your child safe.

The Brady Campaign encourages parents to ask one straightforward question: **"Is there an unlocked gun where my child plays?"**



GUN VIOLENCE RESTRAINING ORDERS (GVRO)

A GVRO is a court order requested by law enforcement that allows firearms to be removed from individuals who pose a threat to themselves or others. If you are concerned that someone who poses a risk of violence may have access to a firearm, contact your local police to obtain GVRO.

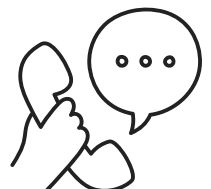
